Please plan to attend our Inaugural RHGNA Open Gardens Tour Saturday, August 10

Rain date is Sunday, August 11.

The day begins with an optional Group Tour at **9am** at the **Rosedale Denver Urban Gardens** located on S. Logan St. across from Harvard Gulch Park. Highlights of the tour include the community gardens' bee hive, orchard, perennial, herb and butterfly gardens and the compost area.

Another optional group tour will be conducted by staff of the **CSU Extension Office** (888 E. Iliff) - visit their Vegetable, Native Plant and Plant Select gardens at **11am**. Since its inception, the vegetable garden has grown and donated 2,000 pounds of fresh, local, organic food to St. Francis Homeless Shelter.

Other than these two special tours, the Open Gardens Tour is

self-guided - you can choose which neighbors' gardens you'd like to visit. (SPECIAL THANKS to all those neighbors who generously offered their gardens for a tour!) Tour Booklets, with garden descriptions and opening hours, will be available all day at DUG's Entrance Gate and outside the CSU Extension Office. On the tour, please be mindful that you are entering private property. Take care when walking though gardens. Homeowners will be present to guide you and answer questions.



There were 14 home sales in the Rosedale Neighborhood during the 2nd quarter of 2013 with an average sold price of \$368,986. This represents a 3.46% increase in home prices from the 1st quarter of this year. There were 11 homes sold in the 1st quarter and the average sold price was \$356,650.

Native Plant Garden in Harvard Gulch Park

Colorado State University Denver Extension has created a Native Plant Demonstration Garden in Harvard Gulch Park thanks to funding from the Colorado Garden Show's Grant Awards Program. This garden will highlight Colorado native plants that perform admirably in Denver and will serve as both an educational and research tool. The Native Plant Demonstration Garden will:

- Increase public awareness of the benefits of growing native plants;
- Show how plants native to Colorado can be combined in an aestheticallypleasing manner;
- Increase use of native plants in home landscapes in Denver;
- Identify which Colorado native plants perform best under tough urban/suburban growing conditions of Denver, which are often quite different from those found in the natural environment; and
- Function as the first Denver component of the highly successful statewide Native Plant Master® Program, which has trained thousands of volunteers in hands-on workshops designed to educate the public about native plants and foster environmental stewardship and sustainable landscaping.

PLEASE NOTE - CSU Extension staff will offer a guided tour of their Plant Select, Vegetable and Native Plant gardens on Sat. August 10, as part of the RHGNA Open Gardens Tour (see page 3).

This will be a great time to talk with CSU Extension Staff about their gardens, and ask all your gardening questions!

HIDDEN GEM OF SOUTH DENVER

Thursday, August 22, 2013 6 - 8 pm

Enjoy a marvelous tour offering unique historical perspective on our community. Harvard Gulch Park once housed the State Home for Dependent and Neglected Children. Nearby lived Verne Sankey, targeted as "public enemy number one." Added to the mix is Porter Hospital, the Dutch presence in



the area, Swallow Hill, and the home of acclaimed author Leona Mattingly Weber, creator of Leave It to Beany.

Meet at the benches in Harvard Gulch Park at the SE corner of South Logan and Iliff. Tour guide Phil Goodstein is the author of *The Ghosts of University Park, Platt Park, and Beyond*. Properly and responsibly recycling electronic equipment is very important.

Electronics contain a variety of harmful and in some cases even toxic substances that when discarded, can pose risks to our health and the environment.

CRT (cathode ray tube) televisions and monitors on average contain 4 to 8 pounds of lead each. Flat panel televisions, laptops, and monitors have mercury containing lamps inside, and electronic circuitry, and some cords and cables contain significant amounts of lead and cadmium.

Recycling these materials also reduces our need to mine or extract more of the natural resources used to make electronics.

Electronics are not Trash!

Effective July 1, 2013, the Colorado's Electronic Recycling Jobs Acts (SB 12-133) prohibits Colorado residents from disposing of electronic waste in

their trash. While it has been illegal for many years for industry, businesses, government agencies, institutions and schools to dispose of **E-waste** in landfills, this new law makes it illegal for Colorado residents and residential waste haulers to trash electronics. *Under this law, it is illegal to throw away basically anything with a plug-in cord, including: TVs, computer monitors, CPUs, computer peripherals, fax machines, laptops, iPhones, Kindles, DVD players, VCRs, radios, stereos, video game consoles, etc.*
