University of Denver Offers a Rich Selection of Events for the Community!

Everyone in our neighborhood knows that we are located a few blocks from the University of Denver. Founded in 1864 - just a few years after the city of Denver itself was founded, DU is one of the country's premier private universities. The 125-acre campus, just east of Rosedale Harvard Gulch, is home to more than 11,500 students hailing from all regions of the United States and 83 other countries. D.U. offers more than 100 undergraduate programs of study and more than 120 graduate and professional programs.

The good news for the residents of Rosedale Harvard Gulch? There are many programs, lectures and events on campus open to the public for free or a nominal fee. Here are a few of the many events coming up in the next several months:

May 3: Open House at DU's Historic Chamberlin Observatory 8:30 pm. The Observatory, completed in 1894, is unique among Denver landmarks. See the stars through its original 120-year-old telescope, which is still working today. Cost: \$2, or free with DU ID. For more information call 303-871-5172.

A bonus on Open House nights is that many Denver Astronomical Society members set up their telescopes on the observatory grounds (in Observatory Park) to share with anyone and everyone interested in taking a look at the wonders of the universe -- stars, planets, galaxies, nebulae, star clusters and more! (There is no charge for viewing through DAS member telescopes.)

May 5: If lectures are more to your liking, at noon DU presents the 2014 Author's Lecture featuring Ari Kelman, Professor of History at the University of California, Davis, speaking about the Sand Creek Massacre. The lecture is in the Anderson Academic Commons' Special Events Room. Free but please RSVP.

May 7: Newman Center for the Performing Arts presents Daniels Voices of Experience featuring Jim Lentz, CEO of Toyota at 6:00 pm.

May 8-10: The Diversity Summit has grown to incorporate leaders in Diversity and Inclusive Excellence from Denver, the region and the nation. The Revival of Harvard Gulch Park - Watchin' the Grass Grow!

As our neighbors anxiously await the greening of our beloved park this spring, our Rosedale Harvard Gulch Neighborhood Association board is in close touch with Denver Parks and Recreation. A massive overhaul of the old irrigation system has been completed. This will be a great long term investment, but for the past several months it has severely impacted the beauty of the park. Large seams are still apparent in the sod, where new pipes were installed in every corner of the park. Our update from Parks is as follows: "The contractor is in the process of final clean-up and seeding/sodding work. In the next few weeks, the contractor is scheduled to start hauling construction debris off site, seed and sod the construction related disturbed areas in the park starting in the southeast and working clock-wise to the northeast corner and de-mobilize from the park. The project team will be conducting multiple walkthroughs once the contractor notifies that he is substantially complete and develop punch-lists of work that does not meet contract specifications and parks standards for the contractor to address this spring as well. The contractor will also be responsible to monitor the new seed and sod areas throughout the growing year for weed control and grass grow-in". Stay tuned for more news as we watch our park come back to life!

A Brief History of the Harvard Gulch/Rosedale Neighborhood by Phil Goodstein

Nobody initially shaped the Rosedale area more than Thomas M. Field. In 1871 he obtained most of the land between South Broadway and South Clarkson Street from Iliff Avenue to Yale. His wife Amanda, who loved roses, planted so many bushes in the area that soon the section was known as Rosedale. Eventually, the couple built a huge mansion near the southwest corner of South Emerson Street and Iliff Avenue. No sooner was it completed than they were badly hit by the 1893 financial panic. He died on August 12, 1893, immersed in financial problems. In the early 20th century, the bulk of the Field estate east of South Logan Street became the Colorado State Home for Dependent and Neglected Children, the state orphanage. The facility included a farm, complete with barns. At the peak of its operations after World War II, the complex was home to more than 500 youths. Seven years after the facility closed on June 30, 1971, the city obtained the land for Harvard Gulch Park, improving it with the golf course and recreation center. The latter had once been part of the State Home's gymnasium. A devastating arson-caused fire led to the demolition of the old Field Mansion in 1989.

Harvard Gulch cuts through the southern part of the park. It is essentially a drainage ditch arising near Yale Avenue and South Colorado Boulevard. Porter Hospital, to the south of Harvard Gulch, was a 1930 gift of industrial Henry M. Porter to the Seventh-Day Adventists as an idyllic sanitarium. Not until after World War II did it emerge as a full-fledged hospital. By the 1970s, numerous auxiliary buildings arose around it.

Denver Christian High School, at the southwest corner of Evans Avenue and South Pearl Street, stems from the strong religious Dutch community that was once in the area. The Dutch Reformed and Christian Reformed churches opened Denver Christian High School in 1950. Eventually, it came to serve members of numerous Christian denominations wanting a conservative religious education for their children.

Rosedale School, at the southeast corner of South Iliff Avenue and Sherman Street, opened in 1924, right by where Amanda Field had planted her initial rose garden. Jacques Benedict was the architect, designing the school to

emphasize the mountain view from its west windows. In 2005, Denver Public Schools voted to close the building, citing a lack of enrollment.

Acclaimed landscape architect Saco R. DeBoer lived at 501–15 Iliff Avenue. University professors, business figures, politicians, and, most of all, everyday people have also made the Harvard Gulch neighborhood their home.
